Take a tour of the church and then have some free time to explore as you would like. In

Drive the "Great River Road" from La Crosse to Prairie du Chien. The Great River Road, a designated National Scenic Byway by the Federal Highway Administration, is an enchanting 250-mile drive along the Mississippi River. We'll start our journey in La Crosse where you will find some of the tallest bluffs along the Wisconsin Great River Road. We'll journey south to Prairie du Chien follow the National Scenic Byway. You will pass Stoddard, a charming village of 815, Genoa which was named after Genoa, Italy, Victory which was named by white settlers

celebrating the defeat of Black Hawk at the Battle of Bad Axe, Ferryville and Lynxville before arriving in Prairie du Chien. Prairie du Chien is Wisconsin's second oldest community. The first catholic congregation was founded here in 1817.
